Daily Bread

"But He answered and said, "It is written, 'Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that proceeds out of the mouth of God." Matthew 4:4 NAS

Bread is the substance of life. It is seen in our culture and our customs. When we work, we are 'making bread.' When we share fellowship over food, we are 'breaking bread.' Jesus referred to Himself as the Bread of Life, and promised that if we came to Him we would no longer hunger. Jesus taught His disciples to pray: Our Father... give us, THIS DAY, our daily bread.

When the children of Israel gathered manna in the desert, they were told to ONLY gather what was needed for the day. Some of them were disobedient, and gathered for the next day, as well. Their surplus became wormy and putrid. Why? Because, God knew that it would be necessary for us to come to Him daily for bread, our fresh word, from His heart.

By reading the scriptures, we learn so much about God. We learn how He thinks, how He works. We learn of His ways, and this His ways are higher than our ways. We learn what His will is and what He wants from us.

There will be times in our lives that we face things that are hard. Situations where there is no win. Life changes that frighten us to our very core. Losses that threaten to completely undo us. Then our hearts cry out: Lord! Give us, THIS DAY, our daily bread. In answer, God sends His

manna, His word of life for that moment, for that challenge, for that situation. BY HIS SPIRIT He breathes that word into our hearts; and, when we receive this Manna from heaven, we are changed. By that word, faith arises. Confidence that we are not facing our challenges alone fills our being. We are no longer broken; but empowered. Empowered to face ANY Goliath that may be attempting to undo us. We are empowered to do the impossible, to go forward when there is no way forward.

This is the miracle of Manna from heaven. This is the mystery of Christ in us. This is the miracle of His word alive and living and active in our hearts. The word spoken, by God, to our hearts, by His spirit. And this is why Jesus taught us to look to Heaven and pray: Give us, this day, our daily bread.

Jesus is the living bread that comes down out of Heaven and gives life unto the world. And He is the One who brings His Word like fresh bread to us each day!

Going For God: Our daily pursuit of Him

My body is not as flexible as it used to be. I see little children squat and stand effortlessly, bend and twist in all directions, and do endless somersaults and cartwheels as they play, and I wonder if I was ever that malleable. It takes more effort to do things that once came easily to me. Sadly, the news is not good. My golf swing will get shorter and my shoehorn longer. As we age our joints wear down, muscles tighten, and bones become more brittle.

Similarly, our faith can become more brittle as we grow older. We take fewer risks, embrace less change, and tend to live in the past. Our steps of faith turn into shuffles rather than leaps. This tendency is not limited to chronological age, however. I know many older believers who are young in faith and young believers who suffer earlyonset spiritual arthritis.

When questioned about why his disciples were not fasting as often as John's disciples, Jesus answered using two metaphors. A new patch sewn into an old garment will pull away from the old garment causing a greater tear, and new wine poured into old wineskins will cause the old wineskins to burst (Matthew 9:16-17). His point? God is doing something new and it will do you well to flex your faith to embrace it.

At every stage of life God is challenges us to flex our faith. Throughout scripture, from Abraham to Acts to Revelation, God calls his people to believe him for more. Paul's personal theme and constant encouragement to the early church was "forget the things that

are behind and strain toward what is ahead (Philippians 3:13)."

A.W. Tozer's book, *The Pursuit of God*. This classic of Christian book said this: "To have found God and still to pursue Him is the soul's paradox of love."

I am inspired to be part of a ministry like Firstlight International with leaders like Dan and Debbie Ecker who are "straining toward what is ahead" as much as ever!

Top Stories: God cares for kids



These three are part of our Families Without Fathers project (FWF) this year. They and 75 others are receiving weekly visits to their homes and or area schools in six locations this year. School fees and related supplies are being provided for each child involved in the program once in April / May, and once in October. Each one has been affected in some way by a fatherless home. Through FWF, we are reaching them with the Gospel.

These kids in particular are from the Suwannakhuha area in northeast Thailand. The FWF project is giving them an opportunity to learn about Jesus and God's great love for them. During a Saturday morning outreach these and many others our learning how to put God *first* in their lives. Little by little progress is being made.

Recently 13 of these kids joined with 15 others FWF kids from from our Seka work and attended and ISERVE concert in Udon Thani, Thailand. For most of them, this would have been the first time they would have experienced anything like this. A life-changing moment!

These are those who are sharing Christ regularly in Thailand. As part of the Firstlight Fellowship Church Network - Thailand, we are becoming more intentional about training and releasing others to share their faith.

In 2014 we set a goal to hold quarterly evangelistic outreaches in each location where Firstlight is planting churches. Hundreds of tracts and Bibles are being distributed in local Thai communities in the region. Next up are the Seka, and the Khon Kaen areas later this year.

When small teams like these go out they are prayed up, filled up, bold, and excited to share Christ with their neighbors, family and friends. Often times those they have come in contact with are invited to attend a church service in their area. In one location the following Sunday after one of these outreaches took place, we experienced over 15 new people attend a service and 9 of them gave their lives to Christ that day! PTL!
