Stand Firm

“Be on guard. Stand firm in the faith. Be courageous. Be strong.” I Corinthians 16:13 NLT

When I was very near giving birth to my son with a circumference of dizzying proportion, I decided to take a walk through my small town. I waddled down main street, the spring air lifting my spirits. As I passed a small shoe store, I felt an overwhelming urge to go in.

Inside I met a woman who worked there, and before long I knew why I had entered. She quickly revealed to me she had recently been widowed, that her husband had died of cancer, that he had found Christ when he was diagnosed and that he was hopeful and joyful to the end. Then she told me the saddest thing. She said she was an avowed atheist. If the love her husband had for God was not good enough for God to choose to heal him, then there must not be a God.

Strong words, spoken with conviction; she voiced one of life's unanswerable questions: If there is a God, why do bad things happen to good people? I breathed a prayer: 'What words do YOU have for her, Lord?'

I took her hand, and said how very, very sorry I was that she had lost her husband. I told her how inspired I was by his faith; through the suffering even to his death. I was humbled by such faith. Then I heard this bedrock truth come out of my mouth straight from heaven:

'Life is hard. It is so hard. It is unkind and unfair and NO one seems

to escape the worst things life brings. It is frightening sometimes, and terrible. But. No matter what life will dish out to me, I am thankful that I have God's love to lean on, His big loving arms to hold me in the darkest nights of my soul. That even when I do not know what to do, or why something is happening I can be comforted by His love and His presence. And I do not know how people who do not know that love can survive this awful, terrifying life.'

She looked stunned, realizing that she might be pushing away the very thing that could make her better again. Tears came to her eyes. I said, 'I know one thing: I guarantee you that your dear husband was praying for you during that entire time and that even now he is praying for you to come to know the love and peace that he found in Jesus.'

Then the tears fell. We stood there on that lovely spring day in that fancy shoe shop, one very pregnant, sweaty missionary wife and one perfectly coiffed, elegant widow and prayed and invited the Presence of the Comforter to come. The love and joy that is Jesus flooded that shop and filled us. She smiled through her tears. She was connected. She was brave. She could stand firm. She had faith.

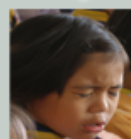
One of our core objectives in 2018 is to provide Care For Kingdom Families: A biblical response for reaching children at risk and children and families from fatherless homes for Christ.

*** From Fatherless Homes:** This is being done through Families Without Fathers FWF, project and Project REAP: Regional Education Assistance Program with 30 plus children and young adults in four locations across Thailand. Plans are being formed to place these projects in several Thai churches in at least two new locations in selected areas this year. Project REAP and FWF are proving to be effective for bringing Christ into fatherless homes, areas schools, and in some cases universities. School fees and related supplies are being provided for every child involved in these two projects.

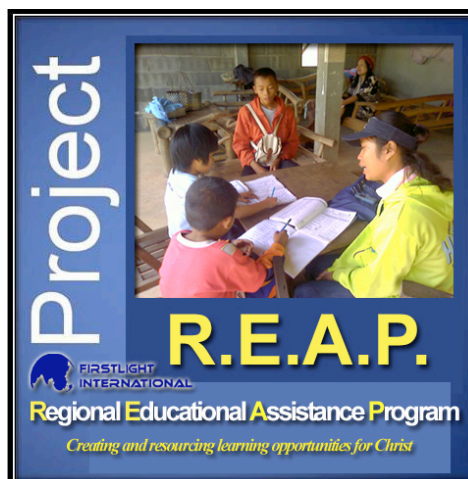
*** Reaching Children At Risk:** In Myanmar, we are partnered with some amazing people in Lishio, at the Harvest Children's Home. Luke and Jennivive (*our project host couple*) and a core of 10 national church planters, are providing care for 40 plus children at risk and they are preaching the Good News of Jesus in over 48 villages of the Pulang. Regular trainings and water baptisms are taking place.

Myanmar Highlights

The person on the left is Pastor Joseph Deih Lian. He and his wife Lydia are pioneer church planters in Yangon, Myanmar's capital city. I (Dan) was invited to teach a three day Thanksgiving & Equipping Seminar as Victory Community Church celebrated its 11th Year Anniversary. Together we equipped 40 plus church members on how to advance the Kingdom through personal witness, prayer, hearing from God, and prophetic evangelism. From there Pastor Joseph and I traveled further upcountry to Kalaymyo, where together we trained another 30 Seminary students for three days at the Emmanuel Theological Seminary (ETS). There, too, the training involved advancing the Kingdom through acts of power from a restored identity in Christ. As an Executive Advisor to this university, we graduated another nine students with Masters Degrees.

Word Up: *An Hour is Coming and Now is*

In John chapter 4, we find an amazing story in a dialogue

that Jesus is having with a women who had come to draw water from a well. The scripture tell us that Jesus had to pass through this region called Samaria, and as you read the story, you soon discover why. It's amazing to see how the Lord puts us in those places that have been intended for us even though we might not know the full implications of what is about to unfold.

Jesus, being weary from his journey, sits down by this well and who shows up but a woman who needs God! From

this simple and yet profound conversation between two people who historically would have had no dealings with each other: Jesus who was Jewish and this women who is a Samaritan - even though they were sister religions, historically they had no dealing with each other. We learn this from the words of the woman in her response to Jesus asking her for a drink (v.7-9).

However, the moment this question was asked, a pathway for hidden truth to be revealed was opened. The whole idea of how Jesus takes her from an understanding of 'natural water' that her ancestor Jacob drank, to this woman desiring Holy Spirit Salvation water that 'becomes a well springing up to eternal life' insider of her was a mystery that she would find to be true.

Jesus spoke of an hour that moves her from a 'place of worship' at a mountain, (*a Samaritan belief*) and from a city, Jerusalem, (*a Jewish belief*), to a Person, (*God*). Who is a Spirit to be worshipped in spirit and in truth, (v. 21-24). That hour had now come!

In this dialogue Jesus speaks from a 'future present' perspective; about something that is 'coming' not here yet (future) to 'now is' or has shown up, it has now arrived (present tense). He spoke of something that was to come - something that she knew was on its way, (*I know that Messiah is coming*) and what Jesus was saying now is: What you've been waiting for is now here! This story teaches us that what God has 'promised' is coming will 'show up' in our 'now is' moments!
